The proposed College E-Governance System addresses these limitations by integrating role-based secure access, automated administrative processes, and analytical tools that support better decision-making.

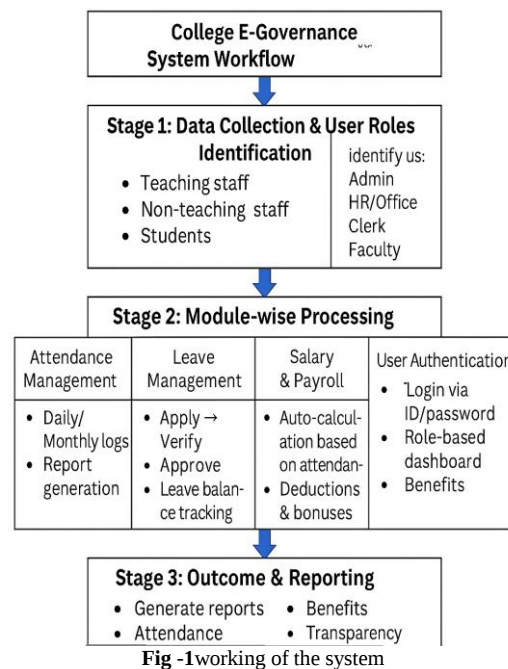


Fig -1 working of the system
